We are in the process of making sure everyone who pays for their before and after school club using Child Care Vouchers or the HMRC gateway accounts are up to date with payments. Please can parents log in and take a look at their balances. If they are not what you were expecting to see please can you check to see that all the payments you have made have been added. If you would like us to check for you, please email all your proof of payments back to September 2022 we will happily do this for you.

Going forward when you make a payment if you can email the details to Juniper Club straight away we would appreciate it. We need the child's name the date the reference number either from the Government Gateway or your child care provider and the amount. If you do not tell us the money will go to Worcestershire C C but it will just sit in their account and not be sent across to us!

The aim is that everyone's before and after school care amounts should be a zero by the end of the Summer term ready to start again in September.

Please can we remind everyone that school uniform should be worn at all times. Please can children with long hair have it tied back for school as this helps prevent headlice.

Holidays in term time

As you may be aware the Government has renewed appeals to parents not to take their children out of school during term time. The Governors of our school support this appeal. Pupils will only be given permission to take leave in term time if there are exceptional circumstances, all other absences (including holidays) will be unauthorised.

As a school we are asked to inform you that, in line with Worcestershire County Council policy, unauthorised absence may be subject to a penalty notice fine of $\pounds 60$ payable per parent, per child, increasing to $\pounds 120$ each if not paid within 21 days.

Our key priority is to ensure that your child is as successful as possible and able to achieve their full potential. We hope that you are able to support this decision in line with the Local Authority and Government policy a leave is restricted to the 13 weeks school holidays except in exceptional circumstances.

Juniper Club

This is a polite reminder that there is a strict 7 day cut-off for all breakfast and after school club bookings. Bookings must be made via the School Gateway app by going in to the Clubs section, please contact us if you need help setting this up. If you try to book within 7 days, the app will not allow you to. **Please remember this applies to holidays as well**. We are only able to accept late bookings if there is an urgent emergency and this request must be made via telephone to the office. Otherwise please ensure you have booked in advance, as we have to organise staffing.

Please do not send your child to club unless you have a confirmed booking. Parents of children who are not on the register will be contacted and asked to come and collect their child.

We must also remind parents that when there is a holiday the 7 day cut off for bookings still applies.

If you wish to cancel a booking and receive a refund, you can do this on the app with 7 days' notice. Beyond this date we are unable to issue refunds. Please refer to the Information and Terms and Conditions Booklet on the PA Connect app for

School Gateway

We are aware that some people have experienced difficulty when trying to book clubs and events via our school gateway app. Hopefully the majority of these have been sorted with the aid of our user guides etc.

The system will allow parents to make a payment i.e to top up their balance. However, it will also allow you to pay for an event or club without making a booking. This means that parents have paid for a slot at a club but have not booked their child into the club and they do not appear on our register.

When this happens you do see a very clear message informing that you need to make a booking. Unfortunately, some parents are ignoring this message which means our clubs can be oversubscribed.

When a club or event is announced via Parent Apps please make sure that firstly your book your slot and then proceed through the system to make the payment.

If this procedure isn't followed we will have to remove people from the club who have paid but not booked a place and refund their payment.

You can log into School Comms at anytime to look at what you have booked etc.

If you have any queries please don't hesitate to contact the office.

ÎÎ Meals

Please make sure book your child's meal even if they are entitled to universal free meals. We have several parents that repeatedly don't pre-book but expect their child to be fed.

This is becoming increasingly difficult for the kitchen. If you do not pre-book we cannot guarantee that your child will be fed and if we are able to feed them it probably wont be their first choice. We are asking parents to help us by booking!

Free School Meals

We would encourage anybody who thinks they may be eligible, to apply for Free School Meals, even if your child receives the Universal Free School Meals (Reception—Year 2). Children eligible for Free School Meals also get additional support - e.g. help towards paying for school trips and uniform, and as long as the Government is still doing it, food vouchers for certain school holidays. It also helps the school as we receive extra money so that we can put in more support if your child needs it.

We just want to make sure that all our families get everything that they are entitled to.
