At Millfields the Geography curriculum is intended to inspire pupils to develop a deep understanding of the world, gain a sense of place, and appreciate the interdependence of people, places, and environments. The curriculum aims to encourage pupils to think critically, ask questions, and develop a thoughtful and respectful attitude towards the diverse cultures of others. Through a broad range of learning opportunities, pupils learn about local, national and global issues, and develop key geographical skills, such as map reading, fieldwork, and data analysis.

The Geography curriculum is implemented through a range of engaging and challenging activities, to ensure all pupils are motivated, enthused, and challenged. Lessons are well-planned and sequenced, building on prior learning, and offering regular opportunities for assessment and feedback. Teachers use a range of resources, including maps, photos, and real-life case studies, to enhance pupils' understanding, whilst also developing their literacy and numeracy skills through cross-curricular links. Outdoor learning, visits to relevant locations (virtual and real), and fieldwork opportunities will be used to further support the learning of the subject.

Children are given a secure grounding in geographical knowledge, skills, and understanding, building firm foundations ready for future learning in Geography and related subjects. They have a strong appreciation and understanding of the significant impact of Geography on their daily lives, the wider world and the importance of the world around them.
