Fathers Day Breakfast



Childcare Vouchers

If you pay for your before and after school club care using childcare vouchers or via funds from your Government Gateway account, please can you make sure your balance is at zero by the end of the term. We will be notifying parents who still have an outstanding balance at the beginning of July of the amount and asking them to clear it. Booking for events

At our recent Father's Day event we had several people who made a payment for the event but did not follow the process through and actually book their slot. Fortunately, this was spotted on the day before the event and we were able to add the bookings and buy extra food. We have raised the issue with the app company and asked them to look into a solution. However, until this happen's please can we remind parents that if they make a payment they must make sure they also make a booking, failure to do this in the future may mean we are unable to accommodate you at the event.



Please can we remind everyone that school uniform should be worn at all times. Please can children with long hair have it tied back for school as this helps prevent headlice.



Holidays in term time

As you may be aware the Government has renewed appeals to parents not to take their children out of school during term time. The Governors of our school support this appeal. Pupils will only be given permission to take leave in term time if there are exceptional circumstances, all other absences (including holidays) will be unauthorised.

As a school we are asked to inform you that, in line with Worcestershire County Council policy, unauthorised absence may be subject to a penalty notice fine of £60 payable per parent, per child, increasing to £120 each if not paid within 21 days.

Our key priority is to ensure that your child is as successful as possible and able to achieve their full potential. We hope that you are able to support this decision in line with the Local Authority and Government policy a leave is restricted to the 13 weeks school holidays except in exceptional circumstanc-

crashed on Earth - or did he?


He is met by a girl called Lucy who tries to help him by showing what the World is like.

Please make sure book your child's meal even if they are entitled to universal free meals. We have several parents that repeatedly don't pre-book but expect their child to be fed.

This is becoming increasingly difficult for the kitchen. If you do not pre-book we cannot guarantee that your child will be fed and if we are able to feed them it probably wont be their first choice. We are asking parents to help us by booking!



Free School Meals

We would encourage anybody who thinks they may be eligible, to apply for Free School Meals, even if your child receives the Universal Free School Meals (Reception—Year 2). Children eligible for Free School Meals also get additional support - e.g. help towards paying for school trips and uniform, and as long as the Government is still doing it, food vouchers for certain school holidays. It also helps the school as we receive extra money so that we can put in more support if your child needs it.

We just want to make sure that all our families get everything that they are entitled to.


Rowan: Amelia for always being helpful in class and making sure everyone has what they need and are ready to learn. Thank you!


Cedar: Fran for being a considerate and kind member of Cedar. I can always rely on you to help others and tackle any challenge given. Thank you Fran.
