


















We have also made bird feeders to help the wild birds during the harsh winter. Some of us have whittled and decorated wands.

Please continue to dress us up warmly in old, suitable clothes.







Each week we celebrate children that have produced exceptional pieces of work, or have given of their best in class. Well done to all our stars that have worked hard during November 2023.









































Reader Of The Week! Teachers nominate a child in their class to be reader of the week— well done to this months readers of the week who have really impressed us with their reading skills!


There was only 31% active players across the school so let's see if we can get that number up in December!
