Year 1 invited adults in make our very own hedgehog in line with their current topic! The children and their adults worked together to create a beautiful hedgehog out of paper plates or clay. 'I feel like I am back in my art lessons!' said one parent. 'This is so exciting.' said another parent. The children really enjoyed working with their adults and were able to take their finished hedgehog home.

Stone Age Day

On Thursday 9th November Year 3 had a Stone Age Day. The day began with a history lesson about homes from the Stone Age, how they were built and what they were built from. The children then worked in teams to create Stone Age houses from clay and straw. The children also learnt about what people used to wear and what their clothes were made from. They compared this with clothes that they wear today. As part of sharing day, parents were also invited to share some of our learning, working with their children to create Stone Age jewellery, to wear with their 'animal skin' outfits. The children also learnt about tools; their names, how they were made and their uses, before creating their own and striking a pose. We also created cave art, using paint, chalk and charcoal to tell a story. In addition, the children were invited to taste test a variety of berries and honey. Fortunately they did not have to forage these for themselves! The children had a wonderful day and can confidently talk about their learning from this.



Forest school this month—November 2023

In **Acorns** we have been enjoying playing with the Autumn leaves; using them to practise threading, colours, shapes and sizes as well as the fun of mixing them in our mud food.

We are learning about festivals and celebrations, so we used clay to make pinch pot diva lamps for our Diwali sessions.







Year 1

This month we have learned about animal footprints and the different ways we can track creatures. We made footprints with stencils and flour.







We have learned about maps and tried to draw our own treasure maps remembering that we are drawing a birds eye view.







Year 2 - We continued our topic of materials, this time looking at recycling and reusing different materials. We enjoyed making caterpillars , snakes and jewellery from plastic bottles.



One of our sessions followed "Bob, the man on the moon", and we had fun acting out and, remembering the sequence of the story previously read in class.

We were scientists one session, doing an experiment to see how waterproof different materials are.





Year 3—This month we have studied fossils, and learned about the life and achievements of the fossil hunter Mary Anning. We made stalls selling fossils, just like hers.









We set up a Stone Age camp, using sticks and material to represent animal bones and skins. We also made meat or fish drying racks to preserve food over the fire. We practised cutting with sharp flint like our ancestors did.



Year 4– We started the month learning about the importance of Remembrance; we made red leaf poppies with clay and war memorials. We have been so busy helping with the lantern walk preparations this month.

We started our Ancient Egyptian topic with a session about the River Nile.




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Lily-Rose in Holly for being a hard working and helpful team member when building a replica of the Clifton Bridge and for her kindness to others throughout the session.
